




The current ecological crisis requires that we transform our international and domestic legal systems to nurture and not allow the destruction of the Earth community.

For Indigenous Peoples around the world, recognizing rights of nature has always been part and particle of their worldview of living in harmony with nature.










Rather than treating nature as property under the law, rights of nature acknowledges that nature in all its life forms has the right to exist, persist, maintain and regenerate its vital cycles.
